Arrangements for Sports Day



On Monday 16th June Nursery Sports Day will commence at 9.30am on the school field. Please ensure all children have their PE kit, trainers or plim-soles and a named water bottle. There will be a carousel of sporting activities for you to enjoy. On Wednesday 18th June Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Sports Day will start at 1.30pm on the school field. Year 3,4,5 and 6 Sports Day will take will take place on Thursday 19th June starting on the school field at 1.30pm. Parents are welcome to bring seating with them. Refreshments/drinks will be available to purchase. Once the events are finished children will be allowed to leave school only if accompanied by their parent or named adult.

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Creative Week

Children across the school will be involved in many activities over the week.

Nursery/Reception: Will be learning the story of Handa Surprise and creating animal masks in order to act out the story. Making African jewellery and creating dance to African Music.

Year 1: Learning about the Artist Andy Goldworthy. Using outdoor materials to create pieces of art. Developing the topic on mini beasts doing observational drawings. Working with an artist Mark Todman making mini beast mosaics for the outdoor classroom.

Year 2: The theme is "Around The World" and looking at different countries. There will be a variety of activities including dance, food tasting and making costumes. The class will also be working with Mark Todman creating artwork for the outdoor area.

Year 3: Visiting the House of Objects in Newcastle to make recycled items. Creating artwork linked to Eric Joyner, making a moving robot and learning a robot dance.

Year 4: A visit from a graffiti artist to produce a mural linked to the World Cup. Samba dancing and learning to play samba drums.

Year 5: Learning about Monet. A visit from Oxclose Academy Art Department to help create a mural using paints and canvasses.

Year 6: Traditional stories looking at the Lambton Worm. A visit to Penshaw Monument. Focusing on illustrations in the style of Quenton Blake.

We also have a number of visitors booked throughout the week for assemblies and to work in classes including an author Tony Wilson, music with Brendan Renwick and Dan Bovill and dancing with Debi Cairns. We have also arranged for a child's rock band to perform. We are sure that the children will enjoy all the different experiences throughout the week.

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Infant Free School Meals

As you may be aware from September 2014 every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive a free school meal. This will give your child access to a hot and nutritious meal at lunchtime, with the aim of teaching healthier eating habits, boosting performance in school and also saving money (in Sunderland families will save approximately £360 per child, per year). It is important that every child who wishes to have a healthy and nutritious meal can have one. The schools meal service is able to provide meals on a daily basis to children with a range of medical conditions. If your child has a specific dietary need related to a medical condition and you wish them to have a school meal please provide a written request to school from a Doctor by the beginning of July.

If you do not wish your child to have a free meal and you would like them to have packed lunch please inform the school office.

School Visits



Year 3 visited Sunderland Winter Gardens and were plant detectives for the day and learnt about what plants need to survive. They also learnt about different exotic plants and took part in a workshop. They planted their own seeds which were brought back to school for a science experiment.
