Home Learning

Should your child have to self-isolate, meaning a period of sustained absence, the school will provide timetabled learning for them to complete at home. Home learning resources on our website were used well last term and a similar system will be used again. However, there will also be higher expectations of how much your child will do each day. This will be appropriate to the age of the child and any additional needs. The general principles are outlined below:

- Home learning will be provided daily which will include a Maths activity, an English activity and another subject such as History, Science, Art etc.
 - Teaching videos will be provided and, across the week, there will be learning in different areas of the school curriculum.
 - We will be asking that the children send their work back to school so that the teacher can check the learning and provide feedback as necessary.
- You will be able to request paper copies of the learning if you have no access to the internet.

We will be using Microsoft Teams as a platform for setting and receiving work. This can be accessed from any computer, tablet or smartphone. Your child will have an individual username and login: the login details, as well as those for Timestables Rockstars, Numbots and Purple Mash, can be found in your child's home reading log on a laminated card to keep at home. This will be sent out next week.

School Meals

The school full menu has resumed giving children a choice of hot and cold food at lunchtime. Dinners have increased to £2.30 per day £11.50 per week (payable on a Monday). Due to current restrictions with Covid we ask that parents pay on-line for payments to school. The website is www.sunderland.gov.uk, choosing online payments, school, Blackfell Primary, then school dinners. School then receives a notification of payment. If this is not possible please send money in a sealed named envelope with your child and this will be collected by the class teacher. Dinners must be paid for in advance or on the Monday of that week. If your child currently brings a packed lunch, no thermal flasks with hot soup etc are allowed.

Children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have access to fruit everyday for breaktime.

Due to the restrictions in school we are not currently running tuck-shop for Year 3,4,5,6. We understand that children can become hungry at breaktime and are therefore allowing children to bring in a healthy snack. No crisps or chocolate bars are allowed. We encourage children to bring their own water bottles from home as the fountains are out of use. Children can refill their bottles. Please ensure there are no fizzy drinks or glass bottles (only water or flavoured water).

School Photographs

The school photographer is booked for Tuesday 20th October. Tempest have advised that only individual photographs of children be taken. Due to restrictions around school and class bubbles, siblings and family groups cannot be accommodated at this time. We hope to revisit this in the summer term.

Flu Nasal Spray
