The National Curriculum programme of study indicates that children should "be able to recall and use multiplication and division facts for Multiplication tables up to 12 x 12" by the end of year 4. Times Tables Rockstarz continues to be popular with the children and they will be set new challenges over the Christmas holidays. The children are also tested weekly and certificates are presented at the end of term when children meet their coloured milestone.

## Attendance

We are delighted that the Autumn term attendance is 97.5%. 103 children across school achieved 100% attendance for the Autumn term. Year 2 won Attendance of the month for November with an amazing 100% attendance for the whole month. Children were rewarded with a movie afternoon and treats.
