#### Reception Admission Places - September 2022

Parent/Carers can now apply for their choice of Reception school places from Monday 4th October. Parents are encouraged to apply online at www.sunderland.gov.uk before the deadline of 15th January 2022. If your application is received after this date, it will reduce your chance of being offered your first choice. If any parent/carer would like a visit/tour of our school, please contact the school office. Parents are informed of their offer on Tuesday 19th April 2022.

#### Parking

I am sure everyone is aware of how congested the area at the front of school can become at the beginning and end of the school day. We have staggered start and finish times to try and help with the fluidity and volume of cars. Can parent/carers please ensure the safety of all children and not double park in this area. If possible please walk to school. Please do not park on any double lines. Once you have collected your child please leave the area as quickly as possible.

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School have signed up for children to complete a piece of artwork that can be turned into personalised gifts and keepsakes for parents to purchase. Children will bring home an artwork sheet home on Wednesday. They draw their own picture or design, there are examples on the back of the art sheet. There is also clear guidelines on what art materials to use, for example do not use glitter, pencils or crayons. Please complete the art sheet with your child's name and return to school by Friday 15th October. The artwork will be uploaded onto the My Child's Art website where you can then view and place any orders. These will be delivered to your home in plenty of time for Christmas

and will make perfect stocking fillers to give to your families. School will receive commission on any orders placed which will support our school funds.

#### World Mental Health Day

On Friday 8th October we will be celebrating Mental Health Day. This will be a non uniform day, children are to wear something yellow or wear a yellow accessory and pay £2 to support Young Minds. The school council from Year 5 and 6 have worked really hard organising the day. Positive messages, quotes have been made into bunting to display in each class. Children will work in their house groups filling a box with positive /happy/ items (these to be brought in from home). Various activities have been arranged throughout the morning. Children in Years 3,4,5, 6 will have the opportunity to take part in a yoga session in the afternoon. Photos will be placed on the school website for you to view.

#### Harvest Festival

We will be celebrating Harvest Festival on Thursday 21st October. From Monday 18th October non perishable foods, tins, cereals, dried pasta, rice etc can be sent into school. We will be supporting Washington Food Bank with all the donated food.

School's current attendance is 96% up to today. We aim to achieve the school's target of 97% for the academic year 2021-2022. As part of our commitment to improving the attainment of our pupils, we monitor pupils' attendance and punctuality on a daily basis. We continue to reward children/classes with attendance of the month. For the next 3 weeks, up to half term, spot prizes will be awarded to children across school.

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
