Attendance

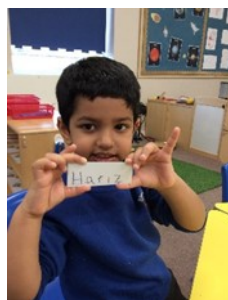

The children have had a fun and busy Spring term 1. The children have enjoyed all activities linked to our theme Destination Outer Space. The children have enjoyed lots of creative activities such as rocket making, creating spaceships and alien head bands. We also got to celebrate Chinese New Year in which the children tried some Chinese food which was enjoyed by all.

Nursery

In maths we have been matching numerals to quantities, and have started to practise to write our numbers. In Literacy we have been recognising our name and beginning to write our name using our letter formation rhymes. Well done Nursery. We are so proud of you!



Reception

In Literacy we have been reading 'Aliens Love Underpants' by Claire Freedman. We have had great fun going on an 'underpants hunt' after the aliens had been to our classroom and made a right mess! The children then used adjectives to describe characters and they were starting to retell the story by remembering the beginning, middle and end.

In Maths we have been learning our number bonds to 5- we have been listening to a great song called 'Number bonds to 5' by Jack Hartmann. We have been ordering numbers and adding 2-digit numbers.

We have been super excited learning all about the Chinese Lunar New Year. We have looked at all of the animals and we learned that this year, it was the year of the Rabbit. We have been very creative making Chinese lion masks and performing a Lion dance. The children were great and had lots of fun.

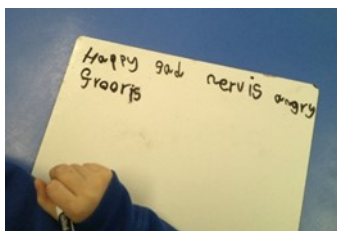


KEY STAGE 1 - YEAR 1

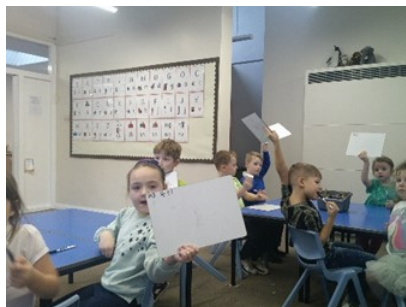
In P.E this term, we have been learning about how exercise makes us feel. Some of the activities we have completed are assault courses, balancing on one leg and seeing how far we can jump. After completing each activity, we discussed how each part of the body feels and why. We have also learnt about the lungs and what they do when we are exercising



It has also been mental health week. We talked about what mental health is and worked in pairs to write down as many different feelings as we could think of. We spoke about how these feelings can be good or bad and how it is normal to feel like this. Miss Richardson asked us what activities we like to do to make us happy or cheer us up. We then each created a drawing of this whilst listening to relaxing music. Once we drew our pictures, we created a paper chain and discussed how the chain is connected just like we are to our family and friends who make us happy.



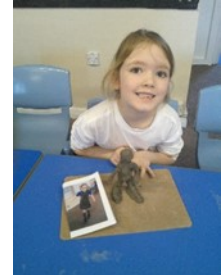

LOWER KEY STAGE 2 - YEAR 3

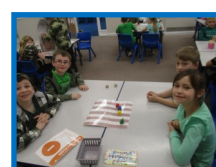

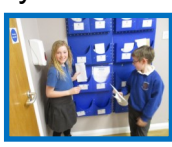

Children's Mental Health and Safer Internet Day

Year 3 have been taking part of lots of different activities in February. On the 7th of February we all enjoyed celebrating Safer Internet Day. We read the story Hanni and the Magic Window. This taught us what to do if we see something inappropriate online.

For Children's Mental Health Week, the theme is Being Connected. We have been learning about positive and negative self esteem. We thought about what people say and how it can affect us. We then talked about how if we are not connected to somebody we can feel lonely and sad. We thought about who we are connected to in school, We then sprinkled some secret kindness to all of the staff around school. We created cards with positive messages and a little sweet treat to brighten up their day.



LOWER KEY STAGE 2 - YEAR 4

Year 4 have been very busy this month! On February 3rd we celebrated Number Day with the NSPCC. Year 4 had a fantastic morning working in small groups to complete a range of challenges linked to multiplication and division. We had to think logically, find multiple solutions and put our times table knowledge to the test! Some of us used practical resources to help us find a solution and others drew out the problem visually on whiteboards. We had a lot of fun! In addition to this, we took part in the national Timestable Rockstar challenge to compete for the highest average of correct answers.



The following week, Year 4 also enjoyed celebrating Safer Internet Day and Children's Mental Health Week with Place2Be.

With the theme for Safer Internet Day being 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online', we participated in different activities which provided opportunities for discussion about how the children spend their time online and what experiences they've had. As a class we created 'The Alpha-net' (an alphabet of anything related to life online); we ranked different online issues from those which posed the lowest risk to children our age to the highest risk and we had a 'snowball fight' where we threw questions we had around the classroom which our peers then answered.



For Children's Mental Health Week, Year 4 had lots of fun exploring the theme 'Let's Connect'. We considered who we would connect with on a day-to-day basis and the impact these connections had on ourselves as well as others. Then we learnt more about one another by playing games such as Bingo and Guess Who? Towards the end of the week, we also worked together with Year 3 to attempt the 'Jerusalema Challenge'. It was a lot of fun trying to help each other learn the steps and complete the dance.



UPPER KEY STAGE 2 - YEAR 5

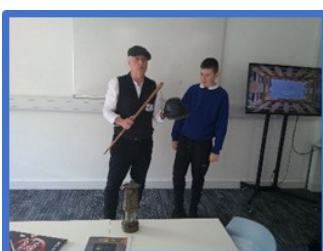

We looked at what it means and the different traditions linked to Chinese New Year. We also spent some time food tasting different Chinese foods. This included noodles, egg fried rice, prawn crackers and vegetable spring rolls. We enjoyed tasting the different foods and some of us discovered some new foods that we now enjoy.



Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed their trip to The Beacon of Light in Sunderland. We enjoyed a range of different activities which allowed us to develop our understanding of Sunderland heritage and the history of coal mining. We were fortunate enough to take part in a sports session with expert coaches where we developed our team skills followed by a session looking at Sunderland football clubs' badge and the history of the badge. We completed a code breaker activity and began designing our own badge for something personal to us. We even got to try on some retro and newer style Sunderland football tops.



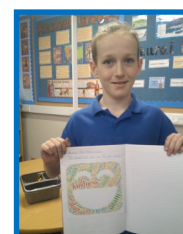
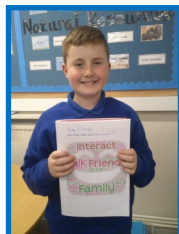
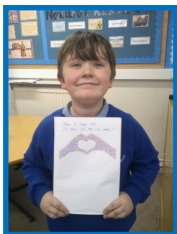
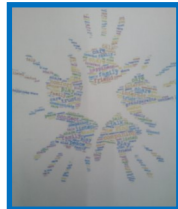

What a busy few weeks we have had in Year 6! We celebrated Children's Mental Health Week as well as World Number Day and Safer Internet Day!

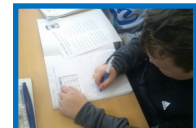
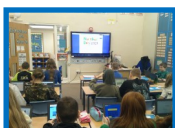
This year's theme for Children's Mental Health Week was 'Let's Connect'. We discussed what a connection was, good connections, bad connections and who we had connected with so far that day. We also talked about different ways of connecting and how on a weekend or evening we may connect more using technology. As part of our lesson we learned how to build good strong connections with people and created these fantastic wordles about connecting with others.



In Music, we have begun to learn the ukulele. We first looked at the different parts of the ukulele and labelled them. Next we learned how to hold a ukulele and do a basic strum. Finally, for this lesson, we learned the chord C. We learned where to hold down the A string on the 3rd fret and practised playing a song with chord C. It was a lot of fun.



On Friday February 3rd, it was NSPCC National Number Day. We had great fun working through mathematical number investigations. We explored finding decimal equivalents of fractions through division and also completing inverse calculations through Roman Numerals. Well done Year 6!



Using the theme of animals within our art lesson, we carefully devised a plan for our clay pots. We thought carefully about the use and audience of our product. We were able to apply our sketching skills to produce some excellent designs. When our designs were finished, we used plasticine to practise and refine our techniques for creating our pots. We carefully used a range of tools to build a plasticine pot which included plaits, coils, swirls and patterned design. We look forward to showing you our final product!
